Cunninghame Scrutiny Group is undertaking a new exercise to help improve services to tenants. They have considered results from our 2021 Tenant Satisfaction Survey and identified areas important to our tenants and that had lower satisfaction levels:

- landscaping, gardens, pathways and drying areas;
- common entrances and door entry systems; and
- bin areas.

They have developed an action plan too and have visited 16 housing areas, conducting interviews with tenants on site with the aim of helping the Association improve shared spaces for the benefit of our tenants.



All tenants and residents' groups are meeting regularly again, face to face, working hard, giving up their own time to support their local communities.

MEET THE NEW TEAMS

During the summer we restructured our Housing Service to reduce the patch sizes of Housing Officers. This allows them to spend more time focusing on tenant outcomes, particularly during the cost-ofliving crisis and energy price increases.

Our Housing Officers will spend the next several months introducing themselves to tenants in their patch. They can provide help with rent enquiries or arrears, garden or common areas and neighbour problems, and can provide excellent housing advice. They can also refer tenants to specialist services for help with more complex needs.



Our West Team covers the North Coast (Millport, Largs, Fairlie, Skelmorlie and West Kilbride) and the Three Towns (Ardrossan, Saltcoats and Stevenston).

The Housing Officers covering the West are Stephanie Morgan, Katie Brown, Derek Cargill, Heather Craig and Collette Smith.

Our East Team covers East Ayrshire (including Kilmarnock, Mauchline and Auchinleck), as well as Irvine, Kilwinning and the Garnock Valley (Beith, Dalry and Kilbirnie) in North Ayrshire.

Our South Team covers Annan, Dumfries, Gretna and Lockerbie in Dumfries and Galloway.


New Build Housing Development

Our Development Team continues to provide new high quality, energy efficient, affordable homes for our tenants. In 2022 we have seen the completion of five developments, delivering a total of **300 new CHA homes** in Saltcoats, Mauchline and Annan. We are currently on site in:

Kilwinning, North Ayrshire

The 72 units at West Byrehill are due to complete in early 2023.





The 64 units at Heathhall are due to complete in Spring 2023.

Saltcoats, North Ayrshire

The 24 units at Green Street are due to complete in Spring 2023.





Kilmarnock, East Ayrshire

The 101 units at Bridgehousehill are due to complete in 2024.

SAFETY FIRST

It's the most wonderful time of the year, but Christmas is also a time to think about safety in your home. Here are our top safety tips for the festive season:

Safe and Secure

Christmas time sees a rise in break-ins and robberies. Protect your property and belongings.

- Don't leave gifts on display in where someone can see them
- Lock all doors even when home, and make sure the rear access is secure
- Lock all windows when you are out, even if only for a short time.

Winter Wellness

Keep your mind and body healthy this winter – get some extra sleep, go for a walk and get some fresh air, and spend time with others. A healthy diet with protein and vegetables will help support your immune system.

Protect Your Pipes

The temperature is dropping this December, so take care to keep warm and avoid damage to your home.

Protect your home from burst pipes by not letting it get too cold – you can set your thermostat at a low temperature or use the heating for short periods. It does not need to be hot in the home to prevent frozen pipes.

Keep warm using blankets, warm clothes and hats and scarves. Check on your elderly neighbours and relatives in cold weather.

If you do have a burst pipe, call our repairs line on 0800 068 1466. Switch off your water heater or boiler, turn off the main stopcock and minimise damage by using buckets and towels to clear up any water.

Fire Safety at Christmas

All Cunninghame Housing Association homes meet the new smoke detection legislation which came into force in February of this year. This means you have the right number of smoke detectors in your home, they are all linked, there is a heat detector in your kitchen and a carbon monoxide alarm if your home has gas. You can help prevent a fire in your home by:

- not overloading electrical sockets or adaptors
- switching off and unplugging all lights when you go out or go to bed
- keeping candles away from your tree and never leaving them unattended
- avoiding cooking under the influence of alcohol and making sure your cooker is always attended when in use.

If you have visitors this Christmas, make sure they know how to escape in an emergency. Also, check on older relatives and neighbours and share these tips, as they are at greater risk of fire.
