The Ardrossan Christmas Decorations Committee has been running since 2001 by a voluntary organisation. Their aim is to improve the quality of life for the people of Ardrossan. They achieve this by the provision of Christmas lights and a festival celebration including the annual Santa Parade bringing community groups together through participation in the Parade as well as the

Christmas Fayre and switch on of lights in Ardrossan.

The funding provided by Cunninghame Housing Association will assist with the financial commitments involved in making the festival celebration and Christmas lights happen in the town. The Christmas event brings much needed cheer to the town at a time that can prove difficult to many as well as creating community spirit.

John Kelly, Chairperson of CHA commented, "the Association are delighted to support the Ardrossan Christmas Decorations Committee in helping them hold their annual Christmas event as well as lighting up the town bringing Christmas cheer and fun to the community".

On Tuesday 26th April 2022 both John Kelly, Chairperson of Cunninghame Housing Association (CHA) and Frank Sweeney, Group Chief Executive of CHA presented a cheque for £1,000 to Dawn Jamieson volunteer and presenter and Steve Hyde, presenter and treasurer at Irvine Beat FM.

Irvine Beat FM is a local radio station who received their full-time community broadcast licence from Ofcom in 2013. The project is a registered charity run by a group of 30 volunteers from the community with a diverse variety of skills and abilities and is governed by the Board of Charity Trustees. Irvine Beat provides entertainment, local information, weather and news, however, the output lays particular emphasis on improving the health and general wellbeing of residents in the communities of North Ayrshire.

Now with Covid restrictions easing the station is reintroducing live information segments from representatives of the DWP, NAC, NHS Scotland and Police Scotland amongst many more that have been contacted and hope to introduce them very shortly on air. Irvine Beat is fully committed to supporting local schools, community groups and charitable organisations by providing an on-air platform for these parties to connect directly with listeners.

Irvine Beat offers volunteering opportunities and is committed to recruiting volunteers from the communities of North Ayrshire in a bid to advance inclusion and education through the provision of training in broadcast media, radio production and administration using hi-spec industry standard equipment.

To provide such an invaluable service comes at a cost, therefore the funding provided by Cunninghame Housing Association will help support the running costs, specifically the phone and wi-fi expenses. This is particularly beneficial at this time, due to recent Covid restrictions, which have had a detrimental effect on any potential income that would normally be earned through local businesses on-air advertising,

Dumfries & Galloway

On 21st February 2022 Alan Somerville, Senior Development Officer of Cunninghame Housing Association, presented a cheque for £1,000 to Duncan Gracie, the Chairperson of Lockerbie Ice Rink along with young skaters, Charley MacBeth and Harris Stewart.

Lockerbie Ice Rink is a Charitable Trust run by a voluntary committee which has been in existence since 1967, providing curling and skating facilities to the local community and surrounding areas for people of all ages. The aim of the ice rink is to encourage public participation in sport by providing recreational facilities, with the object of improving people's health and wellbeing.

The ice rink hosts many different clubs/groups some of which they run free of charge for local young people such as a weekly After School curling session and a Mini Rockers session for younger participants. The funding provided by Cunninghame Housing Association supported the recent facility approved by the committee, which offer free ice skating to young people under the age of 6 years old over a period of 20 weeks.

300th New Build Home, Hallmeadow, Annan

In March 2022, a ceremony was held to celebrate the completion of Cunninghame Housing Association's 300th New Build Home for social rent in Dumfries & Galloway at Hallmeadow, Annan.

Frank Sweeney, Group Chief Executive of CHA commented, "The development at Hallmeadow will see us taking handover of the 300th new home that Cunninghame Housing Association has provided since coming into the Region five years ago, with the 300th new tenant Michelle Sciafe receiving her keys today. Today is about celebrating this milestone in our activity since coming into the Region in 2017. Michelle received her keys on 3rd March 2022, and she has recently moved in with her family and we give them every good wish in their new home".

Park View, Mauchline

In June 2022, Leader of East Ayrshire Council, Douglas Reid carried out the official closing ceremony to mark the completion of Cunninghame Housing Associations new build development at Barskimming Road, Mauchline.



The Association acquired the site in February 2020. The project commenced on site on 22 March 2021 and the official completion date was 14 June 2022.

The site delivered a total of 30 new build homes for rent comprising of a mixture of two- and three-bedroom general needs houses, together with four cottage flats, three amenity bungalows designed for those with amenity needs as well as one wheelchair designed bungalow.

The £4.9m project has been delivered by Cunninghame Housing Association with the support of the Scottish Government and East Ayrshire Council. The funding consisted of £2.6m in Housing Association Grant from the Scottish Government and £2.3m in private finance.

The main contractor for the work was Ashleigh (Scotland) Limited, the Association's Framework Contractor. The new homes have been designed by the project Architect, Robert Potter and partners. Also involved in the project were TCS Construction Consultants who are the quantity surveyors and Clancy Consulting who provided Engineering Services.

Bridgehousehill, Kilmarnock

In August 2022, an opening ceremony was held to celebrate the official start of the housing Development in Bridgehousehill, Kilmarnock, officially carried out by Provost Jim Todd of East Ayrshire Council.

The project is worth £17million and will produce a mixture of two-, three- and four-bedroom general needs houses constructed as well as ten amenity bungalows and five wheelchair bungalows, totalling 101 affordable homes.

The development is being delivered by Cunninghame Housing Association in partnership with East Ayrshire Council, the Scottish Government and Connect Modular Ltd.



Frank Sweeney, Group Chief Executive of Cunninghame Housing Association said, "we are delighted to be working in partnership with Connect Modular to deliver this important development of 101 new modular homes. This is the first modular construction project undertaken by Cunninghame Housing Association and the largest modular low-rise housing development in Scotland. We are excited to be a part of this innovative and efficient method of construction. We recognise the significant environmental benefits of the build and that the units will be built in Connect Modular's Ayrshire factory, to a very high standard and delivered to site. With support of strategic partners, East Ayrshire Council and the Scottish Government, we are able to provide these highly sought after affordable new homes in this popular area of Kilmarnock."
